## BRAC Update

The Base Realignment and Closure Act of 2005 (BRAC) closed or realigned hundreds of United States military installations throughout the country and the world. There have been several BRAC acts since 1991 and no doubt there will be more. These actions are taken to cut costs to the taxpayers and adjust for the changes in warfare training, equipment and personnel. There are two military installations being closed in Horsham Township. Fortunately, a strong military presence (between 2,500 and 4,000 military and civilian personnel) will still remain in Horsham on a Military Enclave located in the vicinity of the Air Force portion of NAS JRB Willow Grove.

## NAVY BASE

The members of the Horsham Township Authority for NAS JRB Willow Grove (HLRA) and indeed the entire Township and Region continue to await the Federal Government's decision on the future of the NAS JRB Willow Grove. As prescribed by law in early 2006 all federal agencies were given an opportunity to acquire some or all of the property from the Navy. With minor exceptions, the Navy, Army and the Air Force have each stated that they have no mission requirements for the Navy's base consisting of approximately 890 acres to include the runway. This does not include the acreage that is currently assigned to the Air Force and is known as the Air Force Reserve Center (AFRC). The Air Force owns approximately 167 acres and had requested approximately 16 acres from the Navy in 2006. The entire Air Force property has been and continues to be included in the Military Enclave that was mandated by BRAC law. Although the 913th Air Force Reserve Unit is to be deactivated in October 2007, the 111th and 270th National Guard units are scheduled to remain along with the Army units that are being located to Horsham as part of BRAC 2005.

There are 7 Army Reserve Centers being closed in our region (one in Horsham-see next column) and those units will be located to the Military Enclave in Horsham. In addition, the Army has requested 40 acres from the Navy for the possible location of a Stryker Brigade. No Military aircraft is slated to remain at the Base. The Governor continues to seek the entire base to be utilized as a joint inter-agency installation. As of this writing, the Navy has denied the Governor's request as presented through the Air Force. However, the Navy has not yet made a surplus determination. If the Navy does not make a surplus determination, the HLRA may not have an opportunity to do the planning for the property at the local level. The HLRA has been recognized by the Department of Defense as the single point of contact for reuse planning. There are many examples throughout the country where local reuse authorities have developed plans with community input that have incorporated uses that are proposed by their State, County and Local Governments. The HLRA and Horsham Township feel strongly that the future of this property should not be determined without a very public and open process. It is only in the manner as prescribed by BRAC law that the local citizens will have input.

## Storm Water Management (MS4)

The goals of all MS4s programs and Horsham Township are to reduce the discharge of pollutants from the township, to protect water quality and to satisfy requirements of the Clean Water Act. Horsham Township would like you to remember that the water and any items that go into a storm sewer go directly to streams and ground water. Water in the storm water sewer does not go to the waste water treatment plant.

Horsham Township needs all of its residents to assist us in keeping our storm water and storm water sewer system clean. You can help by doing simple things, such as cleaning up after your pets, using fertilizers properly and efficiently to prevent excess runoff, and storing materials that could pollute storm water indoors. Also, please monitor storm water inlets near your property. No one should dump anything into the storm sewer system! If you see someone dumping please call the township at 215-643-3131. Thank you

## BRAC Update (continued)

Easton Road with frontage also on Moreland Ave is to be closed. The property is approximately 7 acres. In May, 2006, the Army made a surplus determination and announced its' intention to dispose of the property. The HLRA conducted an extensive outreach program designed to solicit proposals from various entities to include the state, county, local governments, the local school district and agencies providing assistance to the homeless. The Hatboro Horsham School District (HHSD) has expressed a desire to acquire the property. The Army's property is adjacent to the school district property upon which Hallowell Elementary School (*continued p. 2*) and the district's bus garage are located. The existing garage and parking lot are extremely cramped. Hallowell children need additional play area. The acquisition of the Army's property would help to address the school districts needs. The HLRA has supported the HHSD request and will recommend that the property be transferred from the Army to the school district, once the request receives the support of the federal Department of Education. ## Council Meets with Trash Haulers

In an effort to increase the recycling in Horsham Township and to ensure that trash haulers are complying with State law concerning waste disposal, Township Council recently invited the major trash haulers doing business in Horsham to a meeting. The Township is mandated by the State to ensure that an effective recycling program is in effect. In 2003 (the most recent year available for state wide figures), 20.1% of Horsham's municipal waste was recycled. The State goal is 35%. In addition, the state reports minimal participation in the state mandated leaf waste recycling program. Council will continue to explore means to insure that the Township's recycling program is a success. Everyone is asked to do their part. Be sure that your trash hauler recycles glass, aluminum, and newspaper at a minimum. Also, remember to recycle when you are at your place of employment. Businesses in Horsham are required to recycle, paper, cardboard and aluminum at a minimum. You can also help by dropping off your used clothing at the Township's textile recycling bins at the Library and Lukens Park on Dresher Road. Also, please consider composting your leaf/yard waste.

Everybody's Playground, located in Lukens Park at Dresher Road, has finally reopened, and is back to full operational use! 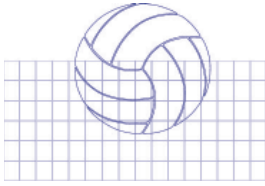

For in-person registration we accept cash, check or credit cards.

- » All Parks and Recreation programs are open to residents and non-residents.
- » All programs will require the completion of a medical release and liability waiver.
- » Unless otherwise stated, all programs are held in the Township Community Center.
- » All programs have a minimum and maximum participation requirement, so please register early.
- » Programs are subject to cancellation due to insufficient registrations, inclement weather or any other reasonable cause.
- » NO REFUNDS will be given unless you provide us with a medical note stating why you cannot participate in the program or if we receive at least 48 hours notice prior to the starting date of the program, as long as your cancellation does not reduce the participation level below the required minimum. There will be a \$10 fee charged for any withdrawal. To withdraw from a bus trip you must give Horsham Township 30 days prior notice, no refunds within 30 days of the trip.
- » If a class is canceled or closed, you will receive a full refund in the form of a check.
- » These are a \$25 charge for any check returned by the bank.

## Traffic Signal News

In an effort to alleviate traffic problems, a new traffic signal has been placed at the intersection of Upper Maple & Easton Roads. Additionally, the signal at Lower Maple & Easton Roads now has a left turn arrow. At Blair Mill & Witmer Roads/Commerce, major improvements are being made, and, at Witmer and Prudential Roads, a new signal is being installed. Both projects are funded by developers. Horsham Township is also working on a Route 611 Corridor project in conjunction with Jenkintown, Abington, Cheltenham, and Upper Moreland, and will be working with Warrington Township on a similar venture in the near future. Both projects are part of the township's ongoing effort to keep traffic controlled. Council has commissioned a study for additional traffic lights, to be located at Cedar Hill Road & Chestnut Lane, along Horsham Road. The township engineer will be completing a study on this intersection, which will be reviewed by PennDot. If the signal is approved, it will be funded by impact fees paid by developers.
