Township Council Takes Position on Airfield

On March 9, 2011 Horsham Township Council made their position known regarding any use of the runway or the Willow Grove Naval Air Station Base future use as an airport. Mark McCouch, Council President, read the following statement:

Council has been approached by a number of residents who are concerned with the reuse of the Navy Base. The overwhelming majority of those residents expressed opposition to the use of the base as an airport. While the Navy Base was open and operating in the Township, we were happy to host our military. It was not always convenient, but we often referred to the inconvenience as the “sound of freedom”. When there was talk of closing the base, Council fought to save it. However, the Department of Defense is closing the base, and we cannot change that decision. Since the announcement that the base would be closed, Council has consistently voiced its opposition to the future use of the base as any type of airport.

As we prepare for the closure of the base, we are aware that there are people outside of the Township who are interested in preserving the airstrip or who at least think it is necessary to explore the feasibility of preserving the airstrip. We recognize that the Horsham Land Reuse Authority (HLRA), through its planning consultant, will explore the feasibility of all possible uses of the base, including a use which would preserve the airstrip.

The members of this Council have served our community for years. Most of us were on Council when the former Governor commissioned the Kimball Study, which showed that the cost of maintaining the airstrip was staggering. We feel confident that continued use of the airstrip is not the best use of the property the Navy leaves behind.

Council looks forward to the opportunity to incorporate the surplus property into our community. But we are opposed to any use of the airstrip for private or commercial purposes. The HLRA will develop the reuse plan for the surplus property, but this Council still has the power to zone and rezone the property. We will work to ensure that the quality of life we all enjoy is not eroded by those who would seek to turn the base into a private airfield, a general

aviation airport, a business park with an airfield or any other use which would decrease our property values or standard of living.

To further their position, on April 4, 2011, Horsham Township Council passed a Resolution opposing the future use of the runway at NASJRB Willow Grove. Mr. William Whiteside abstained because he is a member of the HLRA. Council Vice-President Gregory Nesbitt urge residents to attend monthly HLRA meetings to voice their opposition to future runway use. President McCouch said, "The Council has as much strength and power as the people who are standing behind us".

All Parks and Recreation programs are open to residents and non-residents. All programs will require the completion of a medical release and liability waiver. All programs have a minimum and maximum participation requirement, so please register early. Programs are subject to cancellation due to insufficient registrations, inclement weather or any other reasonable cause. NO REFUNDS will be given unless you provide us with a medical note stating why you cannot participate in the program or if we receive at least 48 hours notice prior to the starting date of the program, as long as your cancellation does not reduce the participation level below the required minimum. There will be a \$10 fee charged for any withdrawal. If your withdrawal impacts the ability of the class to run, you will not be refunded. No refunds will be given for bus trips. If a class is canceled or closed, you will receive a full refund in the form of a check. There is a \$25 charge for any check returned by the bank.

Spring Tree Planting

Planting a tree may seem like a straightforward task, there are decisions to be made and techniques to be followed to ensure success.

1. Consider *where the tree will live*.
2. Decide *what species* to plant. Good choices always include native tree species, search DCNR Native Plant Guide On the web for a list of native PA trees.

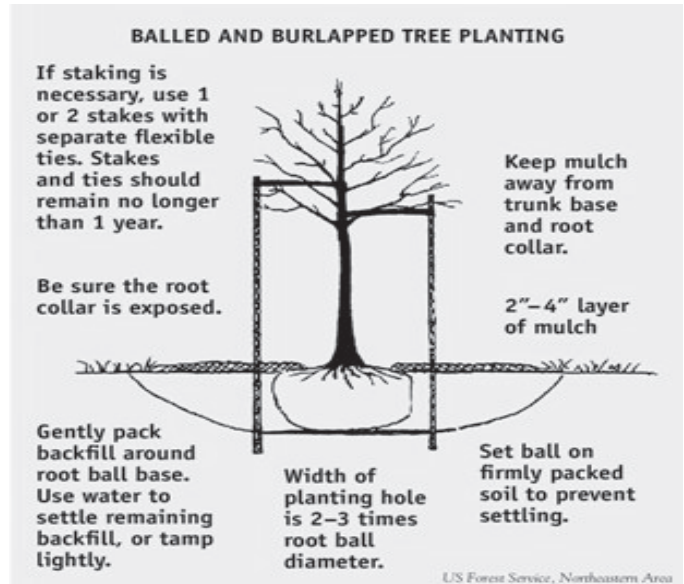
Trees are beneficial to us in many ways. Trees are a source of oxygen. Trees reduce stormwater runoff by capturing and storing rainfall in the canopy and releasing water into the atmosphere through evapotranspiration. In addition, tree roots create soil conditions that promote the infiltration of rainwater into the soil. This helps to replenish our groundwater supply. Trees are appealing to look at, can increase the value of your home and can help cool your home with its shade. Trees help reduce utility costs, can serve as a buffer between your home and road.

Flood Plain Update to Impact Properties

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is updating watershed flood plain boundary maps that determine flood insurance rates in Montgomery County, and the results will likely impact approximately 1,192 properties in Horsham Township. Township Manager Bill Walker states that the new Flood Insurance Rate Maps show 447 properties, totaling 184 acres, being added to the floodplain and 745 properties, totaling 163 acres, being removed from the flood plain in Horsham Township. It is the first time in 14 years that a comprehensive re-examination of flood zones has been conducted.

Homeowners will likely be required to buy flood insurance if their properties fall into a flood plain. And homeowners who will no longer be in a flood plain may be able to drop the coverage entirely. Mr. Walker said, "The new maps will increase public safety by better informing our residents to make decisions about protecting themselves and their properties".

The Township will be identifying affected properties and notifying the owners by mail of the map changes. Mr. Walker encouraged residents to view the new maps, understand how their properties may be affected and learn more about financial steps that they may need to take to protect their investment. Residents can view the maps at the Township Building during normal business hours.



Horsham LRA Update

- The Horsham Township Authority for NAS-JRB Willow Grove (HLRA) has geared up in preparation to plan a successful future for the 892 acres of surplus property at NAS-JRB Willow Grove in Horsham Township. The redevelopment of NAS-JRB Willow Grove is both a challenge and an opportunity that will be completed with local input rather than having the State making the decisions about the future of the base. Community participation in this very important undertaking is encouraged.
- The public is invited to attend a two-day design charrette presented by RKG Associates, Inc. (HLRA land planning consultant) involving members of the community and the HLRA Board. The activities will begin with two public sessions on Friday, June 10, 2011 from 3:00-5:00 p.m. and from 7:00-9:00 p.m. (same information will be provided at both times) and will conclude on Saturday, June 11, 2011 at 4:00 p.m. with a final presentation of the results. Meeting attendees will participate in a design exercise to prepare various sketch concepts for the RKG Team to consider. Join us at 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, June 11, 2011, when RKG will show us how the community's ideas could be incorporated into various reuse alternatives.
